



CORPORATE GOVERNANCE STATEMENT 2025

Equatorial Resources Limited (**Equatorial** or **Company**) and the entities it controls believe corporate governance is important for the Company in conducting its business activities.

The Board has adopted a suite of charters and key corporate governance documents which articulate the policies and procedures followed by Equatorial. These documents are available in the Corporate Governance section of the Company's website, www.equatorialresources.com.au. These documents are reviewed at least annually to address any changes in governance practices and the law.

This Corporate Governance Statement (**Statement**), which is current as at 30 June 2025 and has been approved by the Company's Board, explains how Equatorial complies with the ASX Corporate Governance Council's '*Corporate Governance Principles and Recommendations – 4th Edition*' (**ASX Principles and Recommendations**) in relation to the year ended 30 June 2025.

In addition to the ASX Principles and Recommendations the Board has taken into account a number of important factors in determining its corporate governance policies and procedures, including the:

- relatively simple operations of the Company, which currently only undertakes mineral exploration and development activities;
- cost versus benefit of additional corporate governance requirements or processes;
- size of the Board;
- Board's experience in the resources sector;
- organisational reporting structure and number of reporting functions, operational divisions and employees;
- relatively simple financial affairs with limited complexity and quantum;
- relatively small market capitalisation and economic value of the entity; and
- direct shareholder feedback.
